The Alice Rose

Alice Rose, the elegant 38-foot gentleman's motor launch, is a great way for guests to explore the secluded and sheltered coves of the stunning Fal and Helford Rivers. Scheduled sailings offer the chance to join other guests for a day on the water exploring, enjoy a picnic lunch at anchor, and have a swim - possibly even seeing dolphins. *Alice Rose* is boarded from the pontoons at Smugglers' Cottage in Tolverne. This historic site is where General Eisenhower prepared and briefed his American troops before they embarked on their D-Day landings in 1944.

Maggie O'Nare is The Nare's other private boat, available for guest enjoyment. This classic Cornish crabber is skippered by Proprietor Toby Ashworth and is available for charter for full or half days.

With lessons from the artist-in-residence, to calming treatments at the Carne Bay Spa, to kayaking, sailing, sea fishing, coastal walking, tennis, croquet and more, The Nare is akin to a fabulously comfortable, yet laid-back summer camp for all ages.

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Cornwall



Cornwall is known for its natural beauty: picturesque rural landscapes, stunning sandy beaches, and dramatic coastal scenery. Getting to The Nare

It has never been easier to get to The Nare from the United States. Travelers can fly through to Newquay Cornwall Airport connecting from the US via several cities in the UK and Ireland. See further transport details below (accurate as of our publish date):

- **London:** Daily flights, year-round, currently from Gatwick by Eastern Airways and from London Stansted via Ryanair. There is a direct train from London Paddington to Truro.
- **Manchester:** Daily flights, year-round through Logan Air and in the summer season via easyJet.
- **Dublin:** Passengers flying into the US can use US Immigration pre-clearance at Dublin Airport, skipping any lengthy immigration queues stateside. There are daily flights between Dublin and Newquay, year-round with Aer Lingus and seasonally via Ryanair. This route will also facilitate onward connectivity from Newquay to North America; New York, Boston, Chicago, Washington D.C., Philadelphia, and Toronto.
- There is also the option to fly directly to the hotel by helicopter from anywhere in the UK.

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Alternatively, The Nare's private Range Rover chauffeur service can meet guests curbside in London or at any other air or sea port in mainland Britain by prior arrangement. The journey from London takes about four and a half hours and is a scenic route stopping at Stonehenge or a traditional English pub for lunch. The Nare's driver can also meet guests at Newquay airport or Truro train station by prior arrangement.
