Allow us to (re)introduce you to Park Hotel Kenmare, a jewel on Kenmare Bay.



Guests are welcomed as friends in Kenmare, a Heritage Town just a two-minute walk from the front door, with boutiques, art galleries, eateries, and more. In fact, the town is unique in Ireland in that it has more restaurants than pubs - 40 places to eat, in all, with 6 or 7 excellent restaurants (the hotel staff is happy to provide recommendations).

Bryan owns one of the largest collections of Scully paintings outside of The Guggenheim/Metropolitan Museum of Art.

Kenmare has considered every detail. Whiskey connoisseurs may meet in the Cocktail Bar for private whiskey-tasting experiences. Tours of the kitchen and herb gardens, palm trees, rhododendrons, fuchsias, semi-tropical and rare plants, and botanicals are available with the head gardener. Preferred tee times are available at the adjacent, 18-hole Kenmare Golf Club. In whatever way the team can make a guest feel at home and well cared for, they've put it into practice.



Exploring Kenmare and Beyond



One could check in to Park Hotel Kenmare, never leave the grounds, and have

the stay of a lifetime ... but one must be encouraged to venture out to gorgeous Kenmare, the Ring of Kerry, and the Ring of Beara (with locations featured in the Star Wars films).

This is the ideal jumping-off point for some of Ireland's most epically

beautiful road trips. Guests may trace the Wild Atlantic Way, a tourism trail on

the country's west coast, as well as parts of the north and south coasts. The

2,500-kilometer driving route passes through nine counties and three provinces, from County Donegal's Inishowen Peninsula in Ulster to Kinsale, County Cork, in Munster on the Celtic Sea coast.



they will follow much of the Beara route, with the exception of the Caha Mountain stretch between Kenmare and Glangariff. This is where those who seek the wildest Ireland will find it - a truly remote region with very few tourists and many unspoiled landscapes.

The Ring of Kerry also beckons, a 179-kilometer circular route that takes in rugged and verdant coastal landscapes and rural seaside villages around the Iveragh Peninsula in southwest Ireland. Sekillig Michael, a rocky island with an abandoned 7th-century Christan monastery, is a major destination here - travelers may boat from Portmagee across to the island during the warmer months.


