



Nepal




would be accurate, as Nepal is nearly 75% mountains and has 8 of the 10

tallest peaks in the world, including Mt. Everest at 29,032 feet. On a February FAM trip with advisors from all over the U.S., our **DMC Ventours** International and hotel clients Dwarikas Hotel and Dwarika's Resort revealed

so much more of this diverse country. We started in the colorful capital city of Kathmandu, an ancient city that reflects 2,000 years of peaceful co-existence among its people, which has created a unique blend of Hinduism and Buddhism. We ventured on to Chitwan National Park, Pokhara, and Mustang, ending the trip back in the Kathmandu Valley, with a spectacular Everest helicopter experience.




The Nepalese are among the kindest and most gentle people in the world. Their greeting, "Namaste," is said with palms together and with a slight bow to the person you are meeting. It literally means, "the divine in me honors the divine in you." This outward expression of goodwill toward all was genuinely conveyed to our group throughout the country.



family did not disappoint. The Dwarika's Hotel is truly an oasis of calm in the middle of Kathmandu, a living, breathing museum of Nepali craftsmanship. It feels like a protected village with restaurants and stores, lounge areas to have a drink and play a game of Bag Chal – a tiger and goat board game we all loved (and many of us brought home), and beautiful rooms and suites that look out onto it all. The attention to detail was fabulous. Many know the story of the grandfather, the late Dwarika Das, who rescued wood carvings throughout the city from destruction – windows, doors, trim, walls, statues. He saved and lovingly restored these pieces until they were used to build Dwarika's in the 1970s. Nepal has eight World Heritage Sites and has won two Heritage awards – one for the city of Bhaktapur and the other for Dwarika's Hotel.

The Nepalese are known for their warmth and hospitality, and The Dwarika's



hideaway but has recently grown into a launchpad for some of Nepal's most popular treks and rafting expeditions. Tiger Mountain Lodge, our splendid mountain retreat, occupied a ridge above the valley – just over 3,000 feet above sea level, but with a grandstand view of the Himalayas, including 26,000-foot-high peaks. Our days were spent hiking trails created and utilized by local residents.

Our next stop was Mustang, an area of remote beauty in the north of Nepal surrounded on three sides by Chinese-held Tibet. (Visitors weren't allowed in

in 1992.) We stayed at the newly opened Shinta Mani resort, perched on a hillside with front-facing views of the sacred Nilgiri Peak. All-inclusive, stylish, luxurious, and friendly beyond compare, the resort's outdoors team kept us busy hiking and exploring local mountain villages during the day, while their spa and restaurant team prepared wonderful offerings in the evenings. Our favorite was a multi-course Momo night – where even our dessert was a delicious dumpling!

You can't leave Nepal without looking inward, and <u>Dwarika's Resort</u> in

Dhulikhel was the perfect last stop to ensure we all re-entered the world with a better understanding of ourselves. The resort's in-house Ayurvedic doctor, meditation, yoga, art, and astrology masters, Hindu priest, and visiting monk are on hand to provide guidance.

The Nepalese have a strong belief in Karma, the belief that our actions and

activities influence our health, happiness, and well-being. Dwarika's Resort offered so many opportunities/activities to nurture ourselves and improve our mental and physical well-being. Some of our favorites were their Himalayan salt house and crystal chamber, chakra balancing class, singing bowls experience, and walking barefoot through their meditation maze. If that wasn't enough, Dwarika's Resort also has a helipad from which we

experienced an incredible, once-in-a-lifetime helicopter trip overlooking Mt. Everest – the perfect ending to our Nepal educational adventure.



pleasure that Bhutan offers gives a sense of kinship with the people and their love for the land. As recently as 1961, all entry into the kingdom was still on

Nestled deep in the eastern Himalayas between India and Tibet, the simple

horseback. Druk-yul, the land of the thunder dragon, is only just emerging from the mists of its self-imposed isolation. The last Shangrila is an exotic land of high mountains and lush valleys, snow-clad peaks with clear running springs, a pristine ecology, and an incredible wealth of wildlife.

examples of the best in Bhutanese architecture. Patterns of rich colors adorn every wall, beam, pillar, and door in traditional splendor. Our February FAM trip took us on an enchanting journey with <u>Ventours</u> International through three of the seven valleys of Bhutan to explore this hidden kingdom. Along the way, we took in the majestic Himalayan views, hiked along river trails at Gangtey, a place of peaceful monasteries and flourishing wildlife, visited many of the architecturally stunning Dzongs, and,

of course, made a pilgrimage to Tiger's Nest, perched precariously on a sheer rock face 3,000 feet above the valley floor. There is no doubt that the feeling of being completely off the beaten path, with specially arranged rituals along the way, cleanses one's soul. Switzerland

Switzerland's popularity continues to grow, becoming more appealing to the seasoned traveler as a year-round destination. Some of the most coveted ski resorts in Europe for winter fun give way to warm summer days when the temperatures remain comfortable for exploring breathtaking mountains and endless lakes surrounded by lush valleys and discovering celebrated cities such as Geneva and Zürich.


<u>Hotel d'Angleterre</u> – part of The Red Carnation Hotel Collection. The standout for the wonderful advisors who joined the FAM was the diversity Switzerland offers. We discovered Geneva's French nuances and stunning lake,

in Ascona, on the Swiss-Italian border, where the Mediterranean influences shine through at this lakeside resort.

the famous Jet d'Eau and Mont Blanc beyond. We stayed in beautifully adorned rooms with stunning views across the lake (the largest in central Europe with a total area of approximately 583 square kilometers) and enjoyed a night of live music at the infamous Leopard Bar, the hotel's late-night venue for cocktails and dancing.



navigated the efficient Swiss train network and moved easily from Geneva to Zürich for a two-night immersion into everything The Living Circle celebrates in this charming city. The group's hand-picked first-class hotels and restaurants are set in incomparable locations that stir the soul and provide fresh ingredients for decadent, locally inspired dining. While we were staying at the boutique-style Widder Hotel in the heart of Zürich's historic Old Town, we were treated to a dine-around experience, taking The Living Circle's beautiful boat from the private dock at the riverside Storchen Hotel across Lake Zürich for a gorgeous dinner at Alex Lake Zürich.



Sri Lanka, the land of serendipity and of happy surprises, is not just a destination; it is a once-in-a-lifetime experience! This captivating island has

retained its irresistible beauty, charm, history, and culture in our everchanging world and offers ancient ruins, wildlife safaris, scenic beaches, and heritage. In May, our luxury <u>DMC Ventours International</u> and hotel partner Resplendent Ceylon hosted a curated group of hand-picked travel advisors for a Sri Lanka FAM. From the moment we were greeted at the jet bridge by the VIP assistance arrival service, we knew we were in for a luxurious and exciting adventure.





journey. From there, it was onwards by private plane to the Cultural Zone,

featuring Sri Lanka's ancient kingdoms. We admired the medieval city of the World Heritage Polonnaruwa and Cave Temple at Dambulla and enjoyed a visit to a spice farm. We hiked to the top of Sigiriya, up 1,200 steps to the summit and the most spectacular panorama of the surrounding jungle. We roadtripped to Kandy's enchanting city, marveling at the magnificent Temple of the Tooth and performances by the famous Kandyan dancers. We journeyed by train to Hatton right in the heart of the tea plantations, stepping back in time to the beautiful Ceylon Tea Trails and enjoying their famous tea and flavorful food. From there, we took a seaplane flight on a safari expedition to the Wild Coast Tented Lodge to witness the majestic elephants, leopards, and birds at Yala National Park. Our adventure culminated at <u>Cape Weligama</u>, where we dipped our toes in the surf and strolled the sand along the endless coastline, and visited a working cinnamon estate and the ancient trading fortress city of Galle.



100 Princes Street, Edinburgh, Scotland




The opening of 100 Princes Street was a much anticipated event, and The Red Carnation Hotel Collection timed an educational FAM with The Departure Lounge to perfectly coincide. On April 15th, these advisors and I were the very first to see the new property and were greeted upon arrival by a wonderful Scottish bagpiper who led us all up the beautifully muralled staircase to the heart of the hotel, The Wallace. There, we all stood in awe of the view before us - Edinburgh Castle in all its glory. It was so close, you felt like you could reach out and touch it, and I'm not embarrassed to share that a few of us had tears in our eyes.



Over the course of the next two days, we learned the fascinating history of the

building. This 30-room boutique hotel was once the headquarters of the Royal Overseas League, and the painted mural that covers the length of the beautiful five-story staircase, tells the story of the journeys of Scottish botanists throughout the Victorian era. (Of course, there was an elevator, as well, but the staircase was so beautiful, that none of us took the lift during our entire stay.)
