The connection between Bodysgallen and the fusiliers is a close one: Colonel Henry Mostyn, who owned Bodysgallen at the time, raised the battalion. Those who returned in 1917 planted an oak tree at Bodysgallen in memory of those fallen. At 100 years of age it is now a magnificent specimen, and the road you travel along to reach Bodysgallen Hall is named The Royal Welsh Way after the fusiliers.

A salad dish might be spruced up with citrus tones before a main of New Zealand lamb arrives doused in a velvety Pinot Noir sauce. And to finish? Perhaps a lemon and rhubarb crème brulee tart with sorbet on the side.
